John McCain Education

- -McCain feels that parents should be able to choose which public school their children attend especially if the school in there area is failing.
- -Schools should be able to compete for effective character-building teachers then hire and reward them.

Barack Obama Education

- -Schools that need improvement would be supported rather than punished
- -He wants to increase Head Start funding and allow all students access to pre-school
- -A rigorous training program for teachers that would work in high-need districts would be implemented.

Ok, now the Usual Stuff

I'd like to update everyone on some of the things we hope to get accomplished in the next few months:

- 1. Landscape maintenance our new landscaping service has gotten off to a good start. Thursdays will be the scheduled day for them to be here and we are hoping their level of performance will be much better than the service used last year.
- 2. **Plant replacements and Mulch** beginning this week (June 6th) we are replacing a number of plants and mulching the flower and tree beds.
- 3. **Paver replacements** we will continue to repair pavers this fall based on a ranking of those in most need of repair. If your pavers are to be repaired we will provide you with



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advance notice so that you can move your vehicles out of the garage until the repairs are completed.

- 4. **Shrub pruning** we did a major pruning last fall This means that many of our bushes and shrubs will not look good this year but should look much better in the following years.
- 5. Unit inspections we conducted unit inspections last fall and again in May. We are making arrangements to fix those items that are the Association's responsibility and have sent letters notifying owners of the items they must fix.
- Window/Glass Replacement Last fall, at the annual meeting, several homeowners mentioned that their window seals had failed and/or the wood had rotted. Seven Bridges Courts resident James Murphy, (insert company name) will organize a window replacement and/or seal failure program for all interested residents. - 7. **Window washing** window-washing was completed in May and the target date for the second washing is early October.

Please remember we are a volunteer Board and do our best to respond to issues in a timely manner. We appreciate your patience and share your frustrations that some things seem to take much longer to get done than you or we would like.

Suggested Homeowners Inspection

The SBCA Board is advising all townhome owners to inspect the area under their decks to ensure the seal around the air conditioning unit pipe into the house has not broken. If it has been broken, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to replace the seal to avoid water damage.

Annual Neighborhood Garage Sale

This year's annual garage sale was held on May 16th and 17th and will continue in May in future years in hope of increasing attendance. Thanks to Kim Thanasouras for organizing this year's event.

Garage Doors

For security reasons and uniform appearance all garage doors **must be closed.** The only exception is when the resident is entering or exiting the garage or when the resident is using the garage area. *Declaration Article* 9.2

The Village of Woodridge has ordinances regarding picking up after your pet, but liquid, which can't be picked up damages the grass creating dead spots.
